

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD CHAIR

DEAR FELLOW ARTS ADVOCATE,

When did you discover that you were an advocate for Northeast Indiana's arts, culture, and quality of life?

Throughout 2018, our board and staff members had many opportunities to listen to our donors, artists, patrons, and community leaders as we coordinated partnerships like Arts Campus Fort Wayne, Fort Wayne Public Art Commission, Taste of the Arts, Arts United Awards, and more.

We were amazed to hear personal stories about how Northeast Indiana's vibrant arts and cultural scene has enriched the lives of the people we serve.

Repeated themes included:

- ► Feeling proud to play a role in the "rebirth" of our city as an active and vibrant place - one recognized as a great place to live, work, and play;
- ▶ Reuniting families by attracting a "boomerang" generation back home again;
- Celebrating the achievements of loved ones who are given a platform to share their song, dance, visual art, written word, film, and more;
- ► Exploring "hidden gems" of public mural and sculpture in reactivated alleys, parks, trails, libraries, schools, sidewalks, and buildings;
- Discovering new worldviews, perspectives, and experiences of diverse people in our community.

Perhaps these themes describe your experience? We believe they are expressions of a growing movement of passionate advocates for arts, culture, and our city's momentum.

An energized, vibrant community was the vision of Arts United's founders who in 1955 established Arts United - then known as the Fine Arts Foundation - who recognized a need to re-invent Fort Wayne's identity.

They believed that a mid-sized, Midwestern city lacking oceans and mountains could build a national reputation by playing to its strengths: a robust arts and cultural sector that could rival the amenities of many large cities.

At the time, our city boasted an established art school, growing symphony, thriving community theater programs, historical society, and a fledgling ballet company, yet many of these organizations were struggling to present programming in antiquated and unsafe buildings and lacked coordinated resources and leadership. An arts complex similar to Lincoln Center in New York City was proposed to revitalize Fort Wayne's deteriorating downtown.

Louis I. Kahn, the world-famous architect hired by the Fine Arts Foundation to envision a multi-facility cultural district for Fort Wayne, famously captured the sentiment of the time,

"These organizations of the arts, when they come together to be a single center - does it mean that something new is born? ... I realized that it does, simply by their being together rather than apart."

Beyond bricks and mortar, Kahn referred to a higher concept, one of a shared civic experience. Within Arts Campus Fort Wayne - and radiating throughout Northeast Indiana -- a new, shared experience is born with each performance, exhibit, education program, festival, mural, sculpture, and event.

Arts United was founded to provide coordinated civic planning and centralized resources to fuel the excellence and accessibility of arts and cultural experiences in northeast Indiana - strengthening the national reputation of Fort Wayne.

Today, we're proudly building on six decades of visionary cultural leadership. That's why we are so excited to share our 2018 accomplishments in this Annual Report. As you review it, reach out and tell us why you became an advocate for arts and culture. We're eager to hear your story!

and life insurance administration; payroll processing; general liability and worker's compensation insurance administration; and ArtsTix Community Box Office administration. In turn, organizations that receive grants connect more than 776,000 people to more than 23,000 activities throughout Northeast Indiana.





OUR CELEBRATED HISTORY

Arts United is the third oldest United Arts Fund in the United States and the only organization of its kind in Northeast Indiana. Our history is deep-rooted in bold, forward-thinking initiatives.

1955

Arts United was established as the Fort Wayne
Fine Arts Foundation. The first member organizations
were The Fort Wayne Arts School and Museum, the
Fort Wayne Civic Theatre, and the Fort Wayne Musical
Society. Sam Rea of Rea Magnet Wire was the first
Board Chairman.

1958

Chaired by Margaret Ann Keegan, the first Fine Arts Festival was held at Franke Park. The annual event was held until 1975.

1958

First Annual Fund Drive raised \$88,900 for five arts organizations.

1959

A needs assessment was completed for the arts. Facilities were identified as a critical community need.

1961

After a nationwide search, world-famous architect Louis I. Kahn was hired to develop a vision for a multi-venue downtown arts complex inspired by Lincoln Center in New York City.

1964

The **first capital campaign was launched** to fund the initial phase of the Arts Campus plan.

1970

Construction began on the Performing Arts Center, which was renamed the Arts United Center in 2005 in celebration of Arts United's 50th Anniversary.

1972

Freimann Square Park was dedicated by Fort Wayne Parks and Recreation with a posthumous gift from Magnavox president Frank Freimann.

1973

Arts United Center was opened. Architect Louis Kahn attended opening ceremonies and died shortly after. The first performance in the theatre was presented by Fort Wayne Youtheatre.

1981

The Regional Arts Council was established

to provide project grants and networking opportunities for a larger network of arts organizations.

1984

Fort Wayne Museum of Art was dedicated with proceeds from a 1980 capital campaign.

1988

With leadership from Board Chair Anita Cast, the Fine Arts Foundation was renamed Arts United of Greater Fort Wayne, Inc. to reflect its expanded membership and multi-county footprint.

1989

Board Chairman Ian Rolland led the Renaissance Campaign, establishing a long-term maintenance fund for arts facilities and supporting immediate capital improvements for the History Center, Arts United Center and Embassy Theatre. The campaign also established the Hall Community Arts Center, which houses Cinema Center and Fort Wayne Dance Collective today.

1995

Arts United partnered with the Lincoln Financial Foundation and the Foellinger Foundation to increase arts outreach efforts to benefit youth and their families through the Creative Alternative Programs grant initiative.

2000

Arts United became a Regional Arts Partner of the Indiana Arts Commission to distribute state arts funding.

2009

The inaugural **Taste of the Arts festival was launched** on Arts Campus Fort Wayne.

2010

With leadership from Board Chair Bix Benson, **Arts United led the** *A Home for the Arts* **capital campaign**to develop the Auer Center for Arts & Culture, which houses the Fort Wayne Ballet, Artlink, FAME, Fort
Wayne Trails and Arts United's administrative offices.

2011

The ArtsTix Community Box Office program was developed.

2014

Parkview Physicians Group ArtsLab, an innovative black box theatre, was opened to the public. The first performance was presented by Fort Wayne Youtheatre.

2015

Arts United celebrated its 60th Anniversary with a special Annual Fund Drive for the arts. Arts United led a major cultural and strategic planning initiative and established a community vision for the arts.

2016

Amplify Art!—an innovative crowdfunding program—was developed with a grant from the Knight Foundation in partnership with the Community Foundation of Greater Fort Wayne.

2016

Cultural Advancement Projects, LLC. was established to provide fiscal agencies for programs like Middle Waves Music Festival, Kickstart and Make Music Day.

2016

With leadership from Board Chair Doug Wood, Arts United initiated an inclusive Arts Campus Master Planning effort to prepare for the renovation of the Arts United Center and improvement of Arts Campus Fort Wayne as a regional destination.

2018

Arts United partnered with the City of Fort Wayne to establish the first-ever Fort Wayne Public Art Program and Commission. The program is to be funded through an innovative give-back program and private philanthropy.

Founded in 1988, Arts United's Regional Arts Council (then known as the Community Arts Council) is a program designed to provide a networking forum for area artists and nonprofit administrators, to assist them in achieving their goals, and to help further public awareness of the arts in Northeast Indiana. In 2018, the Regional Arts Council included representatives from 65 arts and culture organizations throughout the region.
